

Zoe came to the YMCA Afterschool program almost two years ago. She has both a hearing and speech impairment that has caused her to be shy and have low self confidence. Her mother reported that a few months ago, she wouldn't have had the courage to do so. The fair even ran over the time limit because Zoe had so much to say!




2011 INCOME

\$ 2,100,000




2011 EXPENSES **BY PROGRAM**
